Here are some points of information:

"Bug Hotel": Our sincere thanks to the McDonald family, Paul, Elaine, Ella, Hannah & Clodagh who built a 'Bug Hotel' for the school. Paul put this in place at the rear fence of the school in early May and the children are now 'furnishing' it with moss, plants, stones, etc. so that it will be a comfortable home for our native insects. Sponsored Silence: Our 2 6^{th} classes and their teachers spent Friday May 4^{th} in complete silence and were sponsored to do so. Standardised Test & Results: As you are aware, we are required to do literacy and numeracy standardised tests with your children each May. These tests were carried over the middle weeks of May. The STEN result for your child will be written on their school report. Please remember that these standardised tests and results are merely providing a snap-shot of your child's performance in literacy and numeracy and are administered (as they must be) in a standardised setting for all. As always if teachers and/or parents have any concerns with regards to your child's learning we have steps and procedures in place to highlight this, plan for intervention if needed and help your children. As always if you have any queries, please contact your child's class teacher.

<u>Book Rental Scheme:</u> A letter will be sent out mid June to all $3^{rd} - 6^{th}$ Classes for next year outlining book rental arrangements. Current books will be collected up soon.

<u>Voluntary Contribution:</u> Sincere thanks to all parents who support the resourcing of your children's school by paying this contribution each year. Because of your generosity we are able to provide properly resource classrooms and maintain a healthy school environment. The contribution for next school year of €130 per child to a max of €300 per family will be requested next September. Any parent(s) who wishes to pay this contribution in June will be facilitated. If any family contributes €250 or more we ask for future help by allowing the school to reclaim some of the tax paid as a further benefit to the school. The form is available from the school office.
