<u>Winter / Christmas Fair</u>: Another magical Christmassy day was held in Scoil Bhríde last Sunday 2nd December. Huge congratulations and thanks to the Parents Association members and volunteers who have worked so hard over the month of November to ensure its success. Thanks also to the teachers and staff who have helped to collect all items and decorate our school to look so festive. Thanks to all families for their donations of books, bric-a-brac, toys, etc for the stalls. The Lego competition was a huge success as always and the Niall Mulvey memorial cup was presented to Ruaidhrí Archbold, the overall winner on Monday 3rd December. A massive €5,090 was raised on the day for school funds. These monies will go towards maths equipment, I.T. maintenance and purchases, books and other classroom resources. Again, a huge thanks to all involved and to those who came along and supported on the day.
